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Subscription Service or Universal Service

The Current "Subscription Service" is where individual residents <u>opt-in</u> to have the franchise hauler provide the garbage, yard waste and bulk services and in turn pay directly to the hauler. Current rate is \$11.16 per month or \$33.48 per quarter. (OPTION 1 and OPTION 3)

The possible "Universal Service" is where the all residents of Unincorporated Indian River County are opted-in and the franchise hauler provides everyone these services. SWDD would collect the cost for these services via the non-ad valorem assessment and we would directly pay the franchise hauler on a monthly basis. (OPTION 2 and OPTION 4)

Customer Provided Carts or Carted Yard Waste Service

The Current Yard Waste service is where residents place yard waste in their own containers or they stack in bundles in their front lawn. (OPTION 1 AND OPTION 2)

The possible Carted Yard Waste Service is where residents would receive a 96-gallon cart to place the yard waste in for collection. The benefit to the customer is lower price as the hauler is no longer having one or two additional workers on the back of the truck reducing both cost, liability and efficiency. Only those customers with excessive yard waste would pay extra. (OPTION 3 AND OPTION 4)



- On-Call Bulk Pick-Up




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Franchise Area – Recycling



Current Once a Week Recycling Services are included in the Annual Landfill Assessment.



Municipalities

- The City of Sebastian entered into a new franchise in 2023 and the City of Vero Beach provides their own solid waste collection services.
- The Town of Indian River Shores is actively participating in this RFP.
- City of Fellsmere is currently using the piggyback clause and may consider the same in the future.
- Town of Orchid may consider using the new piggyback clause.

New Piggyback Clause:

"Franchisee shall allow other Municipalities located within the Recycling Franchise Area to obtain the same solid waste residential collection services and commercial collection services at the same terms and conditions as the County's resulting agreement. Franchisee may negotiate separate agreements with Municipalities located within the Recycling Franchise Area for solid waste collection services that diverge from the terms and conditions in this agreement. County is not a party to any agreement or dispute between Franchisee and any other municipality."

Today's Industry Impacts on the RFP


- Trend to Automated Collection (SWDD's current system)
 - Safety, efficiency, and insurance concerns
- Labor Shifts/Shortages
- Manufacturing Delays
 - Equipment and replacement parts
- Technology Advancements
 - Safety improvements and camera technologies
 - Route software efficiencies
 - Service and performance verification software
 - Real time data access
 - New reporting tools



State of the Industry: Price Increases

- Recent causes:
 - Labor wages and benefits
 - Truck and equipment costs
 - Fuel costs
 - Inflation

Comparison of Current Rates with Other Communities



Note: Direct comparison between rates cautioned due to differences in the level of services provided and contract terms.

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RFP Options Simplified: Subscription or Universal?

- Subscription (Options 1 and 3)
 - Resident's choice to utilize collection services
 - Resident billed monthly by hauler for service
 - Current system

UNINCORPORATED
INDIAN RIVER
COUNTY RESIDENTS
ONLY

- Universal (Options 2 and 4)
 - All Residential Units (SF/MF) receive collection services
 - Annual Solid Waste Collection Assessment would be created
 - May help minimize cost increases

RFP Options Simplified: Non-Carted Yard Waste or Carted Yard Waste?

- Non-Carted YW (Options 1 and 2)
 - Weekly collection in customer provided containers
 - Current system
- Carted YW (Options 3 and 4)
 - Weekly collection in hauler provided carts
 - Improve collection system efficiency and community aesthetics
 - Anticipated minimal cost increase

RFP Process and Results to Date

- Five Responsive Proposals Received
- Selection Committee began review 2/22/24
- First Selection Committee meeting held on 3/8 for Initial Ranking per service option
 - Based solely on each member's interpretation and understanding of written proposals
- Committee developed 64 questions related to the proposals
- Requests for clarification issued to all five proposers on March 14
 - Responses due 5 p.m. Thursday, March 21

RFP Process and Results to Date

- Selection Committee will reconvene for additional discussions
 - Reranking authorized and appropriate throughout the process
- Selection Committee will bring final rankings and recommended service option for Board approval
- Upon Board direction, negotiations with top ranked proposers will begin
- Final agreement presented to the Board

Understanding the Cost Difference of Options

Reminder: Preliminary Stage of Evaluations.

Prices are subject to changes during negotiations.

Options for Single Family Households	PRELIMINARY Proposal Price Ranges	Percent Increase Range of Proposals (Over Current Cost of \$14.10)
Option 1: Subscription / Customer Can Yard Waste	(\$24.16 - \$51.81)	71% - 267%
Option 2: Universal / Customer Can Yard Waste	(\$22.46 - \$43.00)	<i>59% - 205%</i>
Option 3: Subscription / Carted Yard Waste	(\$25.36 - \$53.81)	80% - 282%
Option 4: Universal / Carted Yard Waste	(\$22.80 - \$30.27)	<i>62% - 115%</i>

Note: "Percent Increase Range of Proposals" includes all five received proposals. Percentages are rounded.
